Please read the following expectations carefully. By signing this form, you are agreeing to these expectations. We want to give you privileges as seniors but also need you to acknowledge that you are a student first and an important member of this community. We care about your ability to succeed as well as your safety and to that end want to clearly communicate the responsibilities that go along with this privilege. Students cannot leave campus until this form is signed by parents and students and returned to the Upper School office. Students are not to leave campus for lunch until this is turned in, and they speak directly to me.

We understand that each senior is expected to:

- 1. Follow Prairie rules at all times. Any violation of school rules that occurs off-campus during the lunch hour will be treated the same as an on-campus offense. Remember that you are still in the midst of the school day, and you are representing Prairie in the community.
- 2. Sign in and out for themselves by the Upper School office.
- 3. Be on time for 7th hour class. Class starts at 12:39. You need to be in the classroom (not just the building) at 12:39. If a student is late to 7th hour three times, the student will automatically lose one full week of off-campus privileges. If the tardies continue, students will risk permanent revocation of this privilege.
- 4. Remain on campus at all other times of the school day. This privilege is restricted to the lunch hour (11:52-12:39). Students cannot leave early for off-campus lunch.
- 5. Respect that this privilege is for seniors only. It is forbidden to take underclassmen offcampus for lunch and will result in loss of off-campus privileges.
- 6. Drive responsibly. Students must plan their time carefully. Don't attempt to go somewhere far away or with a long wait. Your safety matters, and we expect you to show your maturity by not putting yourself in a position where reckless driving occurs.
