Student Body

- 274 high school students, including 66 seniors
- Approximately 5% international students
- Our students live in Racine, Kenosha, Milwaukee's south suburbs, and northern Illinois
- We value and intentionally seek diversity in all forms

Advanced Placement Courses

- Students are limited to 2 AP courses as juniors and 3 AP courses as seniors
- A small number of sophomores are invited to take AP World History in lieu of World History 10
- 635 exams were administered in 2013-17
- 85% of the Class of 2017 enrolled in one or more AP courses

Malone Schools Online Network (MSON)

- Courses available to a limited number of students (usually juniors and seniors) at Malone Schools, a consortium of independent schools awarded a Malone Family Foundation grant
- Superior courses (often post-AP) enhance Prairie's college-preparatory curriculum and are taught by experienced independent school educators
- Course instruction is both synchronous (real-time video conferencing) and asynchronous (recorded lectures and exercises completed outside of class)
- Classes use the Stanford Online High School virtual seminar and Harkness Table models, and are limited to 16 students
- Students must have demonstrated and maintain independence, commitment, and active engagement in a discussion seminar setting

Financial Aid

- 49% receive need-based financial aid
- A small number of Upper School students receive merit-based awards (scholarships are funded by our endowment)
- Our endowment is approximately \$41 million

Graduation Requirements

Our graduation requirements reflect our belief in the importance of nurturing and empowering well-rounded students for their college experience and lifelong leadership

- 4 years of English, plus Public Speaking
- 3 years of Social Studies
- 3 years of Mathematics
- 3 years of Science
- 3 years of World Language
- 1-2 years of Fine and Performing Arts (varies according to course selection)
- 1.5 years of Physical Education
- Junior Thesis: long-term research paper on historical or literary topic
- Senior Capstone Project: long-term investigative research paper and presentations to student and adult audiences
- Junior and Senior Interim: two-week internships for career exploration and school-sponsored trips to other countries or national parks
- One major co-curricular commitment each year (75 hrs):
 - Performing Arts: orchestra, jazz ensemble, chorus, audition chorus, theatre, technical theatre
 - Interscholastic Athletic Teams: seven for girls and seven for boys
 - Other Interscholastic Teams: Model OAS, Model UN, Science Olympiad, Robotics, Geography Bowl
 - Publications: yearbook and fine arts magazine
 - Clubs: including but not limited to service, multicultural, math,
 Spectrum (GSA), wilderness and sustainability, Spanish, French,
 and Chinese
 - · Activity independent of school
- Community service to school or community each year (minimum 25 hrs)
- Outdoor Leadership Education: annual four-day experience in Wisconsin's Northwoods to build collaboration, problemsolving, and leadership skills
- Buddy Program: 1:1 partnerships of Upper, Middle, and Primary School students for special activities and mentoring
- Physical activity through interscholastic sports, PE classes, or individual fitness plans each year (minimum 3 times/week)
