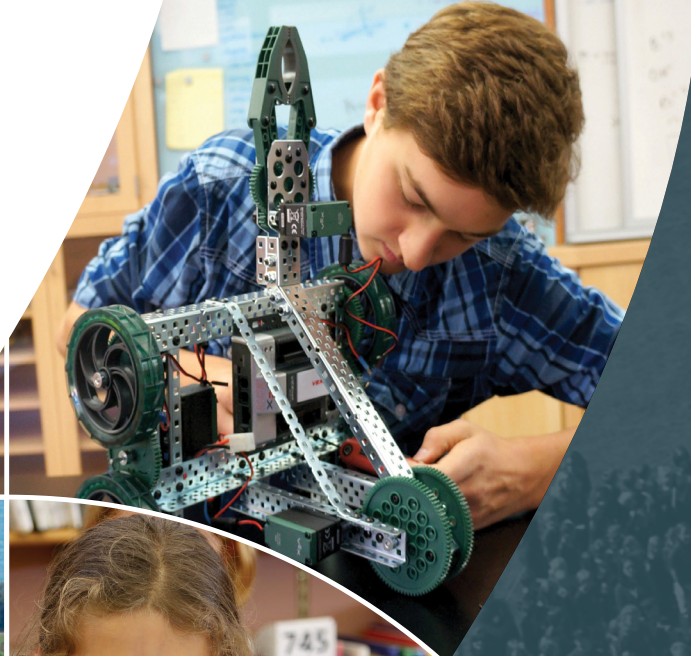

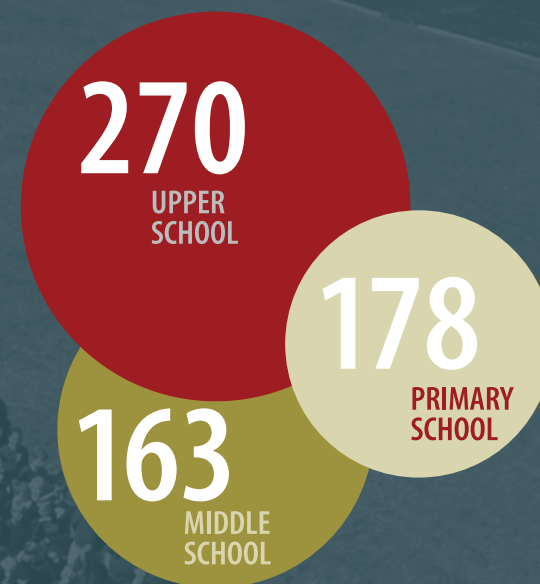

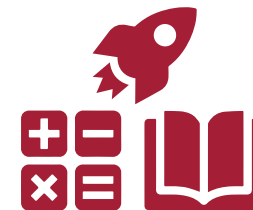

If the seeds of a young mind take root in PS, MS is where they break through and accelerate. By emphasizing the social and emotional needs of students, our teachers are committed to ensuring every individual is not only excelling in math, science, social studies, English and the arts, but that they are growing ever more compassionate and self-aware.

MS is where students learn how to build and nurture relationships. They learn how to stand up for what they believe in. They come to understand the power of curiosity. They learn how to give selflessly through regular community service.

Adolescence is an incredible period in a young person's life – trying, unpredictable and wondrous all at once. Our educators are experts in helping students navigate each and every moment.

### **Morning Meeting**

Every morning at 10:00, students run their own Morning Meeting in the Student Research Center (SRC). Students take turns throughout the year presenting announcements, an engaging experience that fosters leadership and public speaking skills.

### **World Language**

Starting in grade six, students are exposed to world language classes like Spanish and Mandarin. Grades seven and eight provide the equivalent of a high school course, so when students start Upper School, they do so in year two of a traditional high school program.

### **Buddy Program**

Designing "Thank You" cards. Building vehicles. Reading stories. These are just a few of the activities Prairie School Buddies do together. Students are matched up across PS, MS and US, and whether it's a second grader spending time with a seventh grader or a fourth grader hanging with a freshman, these relationships benefit everyone. Older students encourage mentees to think about the world in different, exciting ways; inevitably, younger kids look forward to when they'll be the ones offering advice.

### **Advisory Program**

Even if your own MS experience was great, odds are you still had lots of ups and downs. To help everyone navigate these emotional and formative years as comfortably and confidently as possible, every student is assigned an advisor who serves as the primary liaison between school and home. By doing whatever they can to make sure the student is known, valued, supported and challenged, advisors help students thrive.



# UPPER SCHOOL (9-12)

## Master Teachers

Science, social studies, English literature – these are just a few of the subjects taught by educators possessing doctorate degrees, and with over fifty percent of our faculty members possessing advanced degrees, Prairie gives students accessibility to a collection of teachers that few institutions can match.

## Malone Schools Online Network (MSON)

As one of the few schools in the country receiving a Malone Scholars Program endowment, Prairie is able to participate in the Malone Schools Online Network. Offering courses like *Ancient Greek*, *Creative Writing in the Digital Age*, *Medical Bioethics* and *Philosophy in Pop Culture*, the MSON bolsters Prairie's already robust curriculum. MSON courses are available to Prairie's juniors and seniors.

## College Counseling

With virtually every graduate attending a four-year college or university, we help students consider their options early. College counseling begins freshman year when our counselors provide students and families with the guidance needed to start the selection process. With over 70+ schools visiting campus annually, and with plentiful one-on-one sessions to explore a student's abilities, skills and interests, College Counseling is committed to ensuring every child makes an informed and confident decision about the next phase of their educational career.

## Campus Recording Studio and Soundcloud Channel

School music groups and aspiring musicians alike are able to utilize Prairie's on-campus studio to record their music. The Prairie School Music channel on Soundcloud also affords our artists the opportunity to have their music heard by audiences worldwide. In the spring of 2016, the US Jazz Ensemble utilized the format to debut its first album, *The AP EP*.

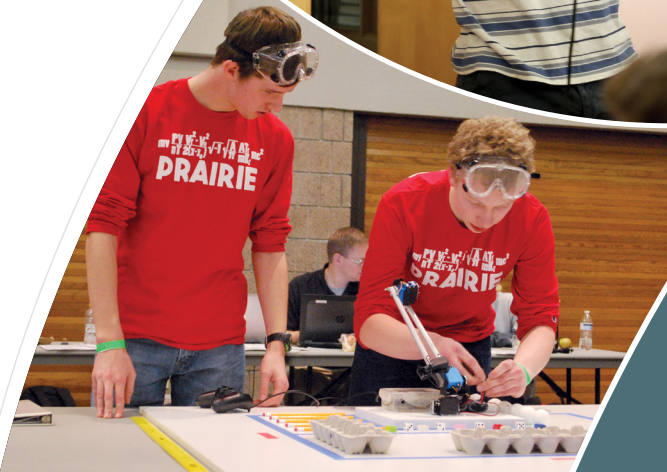
