



MEDICATION PREPARATION FOR CAMP MANITO-WISH AND CAMP LOOK OUT 2026

If your child takes prescription medication:

1. You need to complete a [Prescription Medication Request](#) signed by you and your healthcare provider. Email it to [Julianne Smith](#), School Nurse, or fax it to 262-752-2661.
2. Medications will be delivered to the Health Office by 8/10/26. If there are tablets, deliver only the number of doses needed for the trip in the prescription bottle with your student's name on it. Place the bottle in a clear plastic bag labeled with your student's NAME and GRADE.
3. The camp nurse or an employee of the Prairie School will administer all prescription medications to students in base camp. Students on trail will have their medication administered by their trail guide.
4. Ensure that you have listed your student's prescription medication on their PowerSchool Health page.

If your child takes over-the-counter medication (no prescription required):

1. List your student's medication on their PowerSchool Health page with complete instructions (time of day, dose, etc.). No Prescription Authorization Form is needed for OTC medication.
2. By 8/10/26, deliver only the number of doses needed for the trip in the original packaging that includes the dose, name of medication, and expiration date. Place that in a clear plastic bag labeled with your student's NAME and GRADE.
3. OTC medication will be administered by the camp nurse or an employee of the Prairie School in base camp. Students on trail will have their medications administered by their trail guide.

If your student has emergency medication (Inhalers or Epipen/Auvi Q):

1. By 8/10/26, deliver your student's prescription to the Health Office with an [Emergency Allergy Plan](#) or [Asthma Action Plan](#). If you do not have an Emergency Allergy or Asthma Action Plan, the camp nurse or trail guide will follow a standard plan.
2. Your student may carry their own emergency medication on the bus and in camp. However, you need to deliver a duplicate to the Health Office for the camp nurse or trail guide. The duplicate medication must be in the prescription box. Place the box in a clear plastic bag labeled with your student's NAME and GRADE.
3. If you cannot provide a duplicate, your student must check in with the school nurse or other supervising adult before boarding the bus to ensure your student is carrying their medication.
4. Ensure that you have listed your student's emergency medication on the PowerSchool Health page.
